Изучение древнеуйгурских текстов, хранящихся в рукописных собраниях Европы, Азии и США имеет огромное значение для сохранения культурного наследия народов Центральной Азии, некогда населявших земли Великого шелкового пути. Три крупнейшие коллекции письменных памятников, обнаруженных, главным образом, в Турфанском бассейне, а также на территории Таримской равнины между оазисами Кучи и Хами, находятся в Берлине, Санкт-Петербурге и Киото. Мне выпала почетная роль координатора и консультанта совместного проекта Института восточных рукописей Российской академии наук и научной библиотеки Тоё Бунко, целью которого является каталогизация древнеуйгурских текстов Сериндийского фонда Института восточных рукописей в Санкт-Петербурге. Первый том каталога, подготовленный О.В. Лундышевой, А.А. Туранской (ИВР РАН) и Х. Умэмурой (Тоё Бунко), включает в себя описание древнеуйгурской части Сериндийского фонда, которая уже была введена в научный оборот со времен деятельности В.В. Радлова до наших дней. Составители также постарались учесть еще не вышедшие в свет публикации, о которых нас любезно уведомили коллеги. Издание снабжено факсимile значительного числа описываемых древнеуйгурских фрагментов. Настоящее издание, служащее отправной точкой всеобъемлющего описания древнеуйгурской части Сериндийского фонда ИВР РАН, подчеркивает огромную важность этой коллекции для тюркологии в целом и уйгурovedения в частности. Остается выразить надежду, что все последующие тома каталога будут подготовлены с такой же безукоризненностью. Принося глубокую благодарность участникам и консультантам проекта, я от всей души желаю, чтобы каталогизация древнеуйгурских памятников Санкт-Петербурга получила свое продолжение в издании многочисленных неопубликованных материалов. Я надеюсь, что первый том каталога будет благосклонно принят нашими коллегами, которым мы, в свою очередь, предлагаем принять участие в исследовании и публикации сериндийских текстов, а также, по необходимости или возможности, содействовать нам, присыпая замечания и дополнения к настоящему каталогу.

One of the global tasks of preserving the cultural heritage of the Central Asian peoples along the Silk Road is the study of the Old Uyghur texts which are preserved in numerous collections of Europe, Asia and U.S. The three largest collections of written materials from the Tarim regions between Kucha and Hami and especially from the Turfan basin are located in Berlin, St. Petersburg and Kyoto. It has been an honourable task for me to work as a coordinator and advisor for a joint project between scholars of the Institute of Oriental Manuscripts of the Russian Academy of Sciences and the Toyo Bunko in Tokyo, which aims to produce a catalogue of the Old Uyghur texts of the Serindia collection of the Institute of Oriental Manuscripts in St. Petersburg. The first volume, prepared by Olga Lundysheva and Anna Turanskaya of the Institute of Oriental Manuscripts, in addition to Hiroshi Umemura of the Toyo Bunko, presents the fragments of the Serindia collection that were published since the early days of Wilhelm Radloff up to now, including - depending on what the colleagues have reported to us about their plans - as far as possible also publications that have not yet appeared. Images of a considerable number of fragments conclude the volume. This first part of the catalogue of published texts already underlines the great importance of the Serindia collection for Turkology as a whole and for the study of Old Uyghur culture and literature in particular. It is hoped that the following volumes will be published in the same effective manner. With thanks to all responsible persons and to the collaborators I wish the project of cataloguing the Old Uyghur written materials of St. Petersburg a continuation soon presenting the results on the larger group of the materials which remained unedited. I hope that the present catalogue will be well received by all colleagues who are also invited to participate in the work of editing Serindia texts and, if necessary or possible, to contribute to the cataloguing work by providing corrections and additions.

Предисловие

Настоящее издание представляет собой первый из серии задуманных томов «Каталога древнеуйгурских рукописей и ксилографов Сериндийского фонда Института восточных рукописей Российской Академии наук». В данный том вошли сведения об опубликованных предшественниками-исследователями древнеуйгурских материалах фонда. Это первый опыт создания сводного каталога древнеуйгурских рукописей Санкт-Петербургского собрания. Его необходимость была очевидна еще в начале XX в., когда юному исследователю-туркологу, а впоследствии выдающемуся российскому ученому, члену-корреспонденту АН СССР Сергею Ефимовичу Малову (1880–1957), предложили составить предварительную сводную опись тюркских рукописей из Восточного Туркестана. Исторические обстоятельства помешали воплощению этого плана, и вот, спустя 100 лет, первый том описания уйгурской части коллекции «Сериндика», входящей в рукописное собрание ИВР РАН, выходит в свет.

Коллекция ИВР РАН, созданного 23 (11) ноября 1818 г. как Азиатский Музей (АМ) Санкт-Петербургской Императорской Академии наук, является самым крупным в России и одним из наиболее значимых в мире собраний восточных рукописей. В него входит около 115 тысяч единиц хранения на 65 живых и древних восточных языках.

Коллекция «Сериндика» в собрании ИВР РАН имеет свою особую специфику. Она включает рукописи из одного региона – Центральной Азии, а именно Восточного Туркестана (ныне Синьцзян-Уйгурский автономный район Китая). Сформировалась она в конце XIX – начале XX веков, когда на просторах Внутренней Евразии развернулась «Большая Игра» европейских держав за влияние. Осознание geopolитического значения региона повлекло за собой понимание необходимости его всестороннего изучения, в том числе изучения его истории и культуры. И тогда продолжением политики стало собирательство памятников письменности и искусства, главными событиями которого стали находка рукописи Боуэра в 1890, экспедиция Д.А. Клеменца в Турфан в 1898, открытие дунъхуанской библиотеки в 1900 и обнаружение памятников письменной культуры тангутов П.К. Козловым в 1908 г.

После сенсационного доклада Д.А. Клеменца на XII-ом Международном конгрессе востоковедов в Риме в 1899 г. в Восточный Туркестан устремились европейские и японские экспедиции с археологическими целями. Примечательно, что главным объектом поиска стали рукописи не на китайском языке, а на редких и мертвых языках, открытых как раз в ходе исследовательского бума в регионе в тот период. Видную роль в собирании таких документов сыграл генеральный консул России в Кашгаре Николай Федорович Петровский (1837–1908), коллекция которого в собрании «Сериндики» составила около 500 единиц хранения. Впервые материалы от Н.Ф. Петровского поступили в Азиатский Музей в 1891 г. Затем последовали находки экспедиции В.И. Роборовского 1893 г. Впоследствии консулы в Восточном Туркестане (Н.Н. Кротков, А.А. Дьяков, С.А. Колоколов) стали систематически присыпать собранные ими в регионе рукописи. «Кашгарская рукопись Н.Ф. Петровского», исследованная Сергеем Федоровичем

Ольденбургом (1863–1934), положила начало Сериндийскому (Центральноазиатскому) собранию АМ, которое насчитывает сейчас более 6 тысяч единиц хранения на уйгурском, тохарском, сакском, согдийском и других языках, и является одним из наиболее крупных в мире.

В изучение памятников древнеуйгурской коллекции АМ внесли свой вклад выдающиеся исследователи с мировыми именами — В.В. Радлов, К.Г. Залеман, А.Н. Самойлович. Это, пожалуй, самый заметный фонд, в коллекции АМ – ИВР РАН, где рукописи неотделимы от имен тех, кто их приобрел и исследовал. Уйгурская рукопись «Сутры Золотого блеска» вошла в историю науки во многом в связи с именем ее открывателя и исследователя С.Е. Малова.

Великая Отечественная, Вторая мировая война прервали и российскую традицию исследования памятников древнеуйгурской письменности, и международное сотрудничество в этой области. После войны научными событиями стали обзоры Л.В. Дмитриевой, а затем публикация Л.Ю. Тугушевой уйгурской версии биографии Сюань-цзана, уникального памятника из коллекции ИВР РАН.

С 1990-х годов Санкт-Петербургский филиал Института востоковедения РАН (как тогда назывался ИВР РАН) активно развивал сотрудничество с учеными Японии – с Тоё Бунко и университетом Киото. Результатом стало издание в 2002 г. «Предварительного каталога микрофильмов уйгурских, согдийских и манихейских рукописей из коллекции ИВР РАН», подготовленного А. Якубом, М. Сёгайто и Х. Умэмурой. В области изучения древнеуйгурских текстов главным нашим партнером был безвременно ушедший профессор Сёгайто Масахиро, подготовивший в соавторстве с Л.Ю. Тугушевой издание уйгурской версии *Daśakarmapathāvadānamālā* (Киото, 1998) на основе рукописных материалов, входящих в коллекцию «Сериндика».

Настоящее издание подготовлено международной группой исследователей: м.н.с. лаборатории «Сериндика» ИВР РАН Ольгой Владимировной Лундышевой и Анной Александровной Турanskой, почетным профессором университета Чуо, советником Тоё Бунко Хироси Умэмурой. Научным редактором каталога выступил член-корреспондент Лондонской академии наук Петер Циме.

Профессору Петеру Циме, нашему давнему коллеге и другу, мы хотим выразить особую благодарность. Он не только лично исследовал значительную часть опубликованных материалов из уйгурского собрания ИВР РАН, но и поддерживал молодых исследователей в их первых научных опытах, оказывал и оказывает консультативную поддержку и искренне радеет за продвижение Петербургской коллекции.

Foreword

The present publication opens the series of volumes on the “Catalogue of the Old Uyghur manuscripts and blockprints in the Serindia Collection of the Institute of Oriental manuscripts of the Russian Academy of Sciences”. This volume includes description of the Old Uyghur materials edited and published by preceding researchers. Moreover it could be regarded as the first example of a comprehensive catalogue of Old Uyghur manuscript fragments preserved in St. Petersburg. The need for it surfaced already at the beginning of the 20th c., when a prominent Russian scholar, associate member of the Academy of Sciences of the USSR Sergei Efimovich Malov (1880–1957), by that time a young researcher of Turkic studies, was asked to compile a preliminary inventory of Old Turkic manuscripts from Eastern Turkestan. Historical circumstances prevented the completion of these plans, and finally, a hundred years later, the first volume concerning the Old Uyghur part of the Serindia collection of the IOM, RAS is being released.

Founded on November 23 (11), 1818, as the Asiatic Museum (AM) of the St. Petersburg Imperial Academy of Sciences, the IOM, RAS preserves the largest collection of Oriental manuscripts in Russia and is one of the most significant such collections in the world. It includes approximately 115 thousand items in 65 living and extinct Oriental languages.

The Serindia collection of the IOM RAS has particular significance and its own specific features. It includes manuscripts discovered in Central Asia, in particular Eastern Turkestan (nowadays the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region of China). The history of its formation dates back to the end of the 19th – beginning of the 20th c., when the Russian–British struggle for mastery called “The Great Game” unfolded in the vastness of Inner Eurasia. Growing awareness of the region's geopolitical importance resulted in conducting studies throughout the region, including particular focus on history and culture. This is when the collection of written monuments and artefacts started, within the framework of ongoing foreign policy. The discovery of the so-called Bower manuscript in 1890, the Turfan expedition in 1898 headed by Dmitry A. Klementz, the discovery of the Dunhuang library in 1900 and monuments of Tangut written culture in 1908 by Pyotr K. Kozlov became the most significant events of that period.

After the sensational presentation of Dmitry A. Klementz at the 12th International Congress of Orientalists held in Rome, European and Japanese archaeological expeditions rushed to Eastern Turkestan. It is noteworthy that their main target was manuscripts written not in Chinese, but in rare and dead languages, discovered in the course of the research boom at that time. The Russian consul-general in Kashgar, Nikolai Fyodorovich Petrovsky (1837–1908), played an important role in collecting materials of this kind. A subcollection bearing his name is preserved in the Serindia collection and includes 500 items. The first materials discovered by Nikolai F. Petrovsky were transferred to the Asiatic Museum in 1891. They were followed by numerous finds discovered by the expedition headed by Vsevolod I. Roborovsky in 1983. Afterwards Russian consuls in Eastern Turkestan (Nikolai N. Krotkov, Aleksei A. Dyakov, Sergei A. Kolokolov) started to send the manuscripts obtained in the region regularly. The so-called “Kashgar Manuscript of Nikolai F. Petrovsky” published by Sergei Fyodorovich Oldenburg

(1863–1934), marked the beginning of the Serindia (Central Asian) collection of the AM. The latter includes more than 6 thousand items in Old Uyghur, Tocharian, Saka, Sogdian and other languages and could be considered one of the most valuable manuscript collections in the world.

The outstanding world-known scholars, Wilhelm Radloff, Carl H. Salemann, Aleksander N. Samoilovich, conducted research on the Old Uyghur manuscripts preserved in the AM. The Serindia collection could be considered a unique collection of the AM – IOM, RAS, and the manuscripts were not separated from the names of their acquirers or researchers. Thus, the “Altun Yaruk” manuscript is tightly associated with the name of its discoverer, Sergei E. Malov.

The Great Patriotic War and World War II interrupted Old Uyghur manuscript research in Russia, as well as international cooperation in this field of studies. After the war, academic research restarted and a review paper concerning Old Uyghur materials by Lyudmila V. Dmitrieva and the publication of a significant text in the collection, the Xuanzang biography by Liliya Yu. Tugusheva came to light.

Since the 1990s the St. Petersburg Branch of the Institute of Oriental Studies (former name of the IOM RAS) has actively promoted collaboration with Japanese scholars of Tōyō Bunko and Kyoto University. As a result, “A Provisional Catalogue of the Microfilms of Uyghur, Sogdian and Manichaean Manuscripts belonging to the St. Petersburg Branch of the Institute of Oriental Studies, Russian Academy of Sciences brought to the Tōyō Bunko” by Hiroshi Umemura, Masahiro Shōgaito, Yutaka Yoshida and Abdurishid Yakup was published in 2002 (for internal use). In the field of Old Uyghur manuscript studies our main partner was the untimely departed Shōgaito Masahiro, who prepared the publication, with Liliya Yu. Tugusheva, manuscript fragments of the Daśakarmapathāvadānamālā (Kyoto, 1998) preserved in the Serindia collection.

The present edition is prepared by an international research group: junior researchers of the Serindia laboratory of the IOM RAS Olga Lundysheva and Anna Turanskaya, and Professor Emeritus of Chuo University, councilor of Tōyō Bunko Hiroshi Umemura. The chief editor was the Corresponding member of the British Academy for the Humanities and Social Sciences Peter Zieme.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to Professor Peter Zieme, our long-standing colleague and friend. He is the one who not only conducted analysis of the published Old Uyghur materials of the IOM collection, but also supported the young researchers in their pioneer research attempts, constantly provided consulting support and encouraged the promotion of the St. Petersburg collection.

Сериндийский фонд ИВР РАН¹

Древнеуйгурская письменная традиция, бытавшая на территории Центральной Азии в IX–XVII вв., оставалась неизвестной европейским ученым до конца XIX в. Французский востоковед Станислав Жюльен (1797–1873) был первым в истории европейской науки, кто указал на существование текстов на древнетюркском языке. Он упомянул об этом факте в статье 1849 г., где были изложены результаты его исследования китайского буддийского канона—Трипитаки, составленного по указанию Хубилай-хана в 1285–1287 гг.². Сделанное им замечание впоследствии подтвердили экспедиции конца XIX – начала XX в., во время которых на территории Восточного Туркестана (современный Синьцзян-Уйгурский автономный район, КНР) и в Дунъхуане (провинция Ганьсу, КНР) были обнаружены многочисленные буддийские тексты и деловые документы на древнеуйгурском языке.

Впервые фрагменты древнеуйгурских рукописей и ксилографов были найдены во время одной из русских экспедиций в Восточный Туркестан и Северо-западные регионы Китая под руководством В.И. Роборовского в 1893–1895 гг. Эти фрагменты книг, а также многие другие на различных языках и написанные различными системами письма, впоследствии приобретенные русскими консулами Н.Ф. Петровским и Н.Н. Кротковым, а также экспедициями С.Ф. Ольденбурга 1909–1910 и 1914–1915 гг. и С.Е. Малова 1909–1911 и 1913–1914 гг., составили Сериндийский (ранее Центральноазиатский) фонд ИВР РАН.

Сериндийский фонд является одним из богатейших фондов ИВР РАН: он отличается не только широким хронологическим охватом рукописных материалов, но и языковым разнообразием. Фонд включает 6737 единиц хранения³ на 13 языках (санскрите, пракрите гандхари, тохарских языках А и Б, хотаносакском, согдийском, среднеперсидском (пехлеви), древнеуйгурском, китайском, тибетском, монгольском, арабском и тумшукско-сакском).

История формирования этой рукописной коллекции, которая тесно связана с деятельностью знаменитых русских путешественников–исследователей Центральной Азии, археологов, лингвистов и дипломатов, до конца не изучена. Первые рукописи, ныне входящие в это собрание, попали в Азиатский Музей еще в 1892 г. Как обособленная

коллекция Центральноазиатский фонд упоминается с 1953 г., когда была составлена первая инвентарная книга фрагментов из Центральной Азии.

Фонд был переименован из Центральноазиатского в Сериндийский в мае 2006 г., когда М.И. Воробьева-Десятovская приняла решение провести общую пересифровку фонда по единой системе и унифицировать шифры Сериндийской коллекции под единым грифом SI⁴. Созданная единая система шифров преследовала две цели: облегчить библиотечную и хранительскую работу с фрагментами и сделать материалы более доступными для специалистов.

Сериндийский фонд состоит из 15 коллекций, существенно различающихся по объему и составу⁵. Тринадцать коллекций носят имена людей, приобретшими материалы, которые позднее были переданы в АМ. Изначально они хранились под следующими шифрами: **B** — для коллекции Березовского; **D** — Дьякова; **Kl** — Клеменца; **Koz** — Козлова; **K** — Кохановского; **Kol** — Колоколова; **Kr** — Кроткова; **L** — Лаврова; **M, MA, Mtд** — Малова; **O** — Ольденбурга; **P** — Петровского; **Rob** — Роборовского; **Strel-D** — Стрелкова. Коллекция со старым шифром **Uig** включает материалы на древнеуйгурском языке, сведения о приобретении которых на момент инвентаризации требовали уточнения. Отдельно под шифром **Merv** хранится рукопись, обнаруженная в 1965 г. в Мервском оазисе близ города Байрам-Али в Туркмении. Также вне коллекций хранятся фрагменты (51 единица хранения), которые не имеют «старых» шифров и история происхождения которых на данный момент неизвестна.

Часть материалов Сериндийского фонда была обнаружена в ходе археологических раскопок, что дает нам точную информацию о местах находок рукописей. Наряду с этим материалы приобретались у местного населения, и в этом случае их происхождение определить затруднительно или невозможно. Уже будучи сформированной, коллекция несколько раз перемещалась внутри Петрограда – Ленинграда при переездах Института (бывшего АМ⁶). В ходе эвакуационных мероприятий в период Гражданской войны (1917–1922) рукописная коллекция была вывезена в Саратов⁷. Во время Второй мировой войны

упакованные материалы хранились в подвальных помещениях Библиотеки академии наук в Ленинграде. И хотя на сохранность коллекций эти события не повлияли, в некоторых случаях была утрачена информация о происхождении отдельных материалов (в первую очередь это относится к незаинвентаризованным в тот период единицам хранения). В данный момент ведется архивная работа по восстановлению этих сведений.

Более 300 фрагментов на древнеуйгурском языке хранятся в Дуньхуанском фонде под шифром *Дх*. История приобретения этих фрагментов в настоящий момент недостаточно изучена. Большая часть материалов этого фонда была привезена С.Ф. Ольденбургом из Второй Русской Туркестанской экспедиции (1914–1915 гг.) из пещер Могао в Дуньхуане и Восточного Туркестана. Экспедиции посчастливилось приобрести значительное количество предметов материальной культуры и рукописных фрагментов (приблизительно 20000) в Дуньхуане, а также порядка 300 свитков у местного населения. В настоящий момент очевидно, что некоторые фрагменты на древнеуйгурском, монгольском и тибетском языках были включены в Дуньхуанский фонд из других коллекций, по всей видимости, еще в довоенный период⁸.

История приобретения и обработка древнеуйгурских фрагментов Сериндийского фонда

Значительную часть Сериндийского фонда (4730 единиц хранения) составляют фрагменты рукописей и ксилографов на древнетюркском или древнеуйгурском языке. Эти фрагменты были приобретены во время экспедиций в Восточный Туркестан, организованных Русским географическим обществом (РГО), Русским археологическим обществом (РАО), Русским комитетом для изучения Средней и Восточной Азии (РКСА) на рубеже XIX–XX вв., и по сложившейся практике переданы на хранение в Азиатский Музей Императорской Академии наук (ныне ИВР РАН). Некоторые фрагменты книг и документов из Центральной Азии передавались на хранение сразу же после их прибытия в Петербург; передача иных затянулась на несколько десятилетий⁹.

История формирования коллекции рукописей на древнеуйгурском языке к настоящему моменту полностью не описана (за исключением разрозненных сведений в немногочисленных научных публикациях¹⁰), и в ней немало лакун, которые, по всей вероятности, никогда не будут восполнены в силу разных обстоятельств. Однако некоторые архивные документы (инвентарные книги¹¹, документы из Архива востоковедов ИВР РАН¹², протоколы заседаний РКСА, частная переписка

фондообразователей и описи рукописей¹³⁾ могут пролить свет на общую историю формирования древнеуйгурской части коллекции.

Коллекции Роборовского и Клеменца (Rob., Kle-Rob., Uig)

Первая попытка систематизации коллекции рукописных и печатных книг АМ относится к 1918–1920 гг., когда научными работниками Музея также было подготовлено издание «Азиатский Музей Российской Академии Наук. 1818–1918. Краткая памятка». Автором раздела «Турки» выступил А.Н. Самойлович, один из крупнейших российских тюркологов первой половины XX в., директор Института востоковедения АН СССР в 1934–1937 гг., отвечавший в то время за хранение и инвентаризацию тюркской части рукописного собрания. По его словам, «... в Азиатском Музее ни к моменту его основания, ни значительно позже, уйгурских рукописей не имелось. Первыми поступлениями являются отрывки среди рукописных материалов из Восточного Туркестана, вывезенных [В.И.] Роборовским и П.К. Козловым в 1897 году и переданных Музею Русским Географическим обществом. ... Следующие уйгурские материалы были доставлены экспедицией в Турфан 1898 г. Д.А. Клеменца»¹⁴.

Участник третьей и четвертой экспедиций Н.М. Пржевальского в Центральную Азию, Всеволод Иванович Роборовский (1856–1910), возглавил экспедицию, организованную РГО в Восточный Туркестан и Северо-Западный Китай в 1893–1895. гг. Экспедиция не ставила перед собой археологических целей. Тем не менее В.И. Роборовскому удалось приобрести фрагменты рукописей на различных языках, в том числе древнеуйгурском. Согласно опубликованным позднее экспедиционным запискам, ему посчастливилось купить несколько свитков большого размера (приблизительно 20 см шириной и 280 см длиной) у местных жителей в окрестностях развалин Идыкут-шари, бывшей резиденции правителей Кочо: «... Раскапывая эти развалины, чанту часто находят различные предметы обихода прежних жителей-уйгуров — старую глиняную посуду, стеклянные цветные украшения, монеты серебряные и медные, множество рукописей. Образцы этих вещей мне удалось приобрести. Добытые в свитках рукописи были до фута шириной и до четырех аришин длиной»¹⁵.

«...в 1896 году в ИРГО поступил мешок с обрывками китайских и уйгурских рукописей, подобранных и купленных в разных местах Турфанского оазиса, главным образом, по-видимому, в Идикут-шари и Тююк-мазаре экспедицией, совершенной в Среднюю Азию

В.И. Роборовским и П.К. Козловым в 1894–1895 гг. ... Секретарь Общества Александр Васильевич Григорьев ... искал возможности разобраться в содержимом мешка. Он обратился к С.Ф. Ольденбургу, который вместе с А.О. Ивановским разобрал рукописи и нашел обрывки китайские, уйгурские, санскритские и двуязычные: уйгурские с санскритской транскрипцией; он их представил В.В. Радлову, который, заинтересовавшись ими, сделал о них доклад в Академии наук»¹⁶.

Позднее В.В. Радлов описывал привезенные древнеуйгурские материалы в своей статье «Образцы древнеуйгурского языка из Турфана»: «*В декабре 1897 г. мне было передано некоторое количество исписанных обрывков бумаги, которые русские путешественники Роборовский и Козлов привезли из Турфана в Санкт-Петербург и передали Императорскому Русскому географическому обществу. Более тщательный анализ этих рукописных фрагментов дал следующий результат: большинство документов содержало тюркские тексты, записанные уйгурскими буквами, которые, судя по почеркам и использованной для них бумаге, можно было разделить на две четко различающиеся группы. Первая группа была написана на одной стороне очень тонкой необработанной сырой и шероховатой бумаги; надписи округлой формы были легко набросаны кистью и производили впечатление скорописи, которая могла использоваться только в деловых документах»¹⁷.*

Эти «случайные» находки, сделанные экспедицией В.И. Роборовского, вызвали такой интерес в научном сообществе, что Императорская Академия наук отправила в регион археологическую экспедицию под руководством Д.А. Клеменца¹⁸. Дмитрий Александрович Клеменц (1848–1914), российский путешественник, археолог, инициатор и вдохновитель первых русских научно-исследовательских археологических экспедиций в Восточный Туркестан, посетил Турфан (Идыкут-шари и Туюк-мазар) в 1898 г. И хотя он сам не считал обнаруженные в Хара-ходже материалы значимыми¹⁹, В.В. Радлов высоко оценил привезенные им фрагменты книг²⁰: «*Эти письменные памятники можно разделить на пять групп: 1) оттиски древнетюркских надписей, нацарапанных на стенах пещерного жилища; 2) фрагменты штукатурки из пещерных монастырей с уйгурскими надписями, написанными черной или коричнево-красной краской; 3) фрагменты буддийских религиозных рукописей; 4) фрагменты буддийских книг, отпечатанных ксилографическим способом; 5) деловые документы на уйгурском языке. Последние представляют исключительную ценность, поскольку содержат полный [текст], и за исключением отдельных мест не повреждены и легко поддаются расшифровке. Помимо нескольких сохранившихся лишь частично фрагментов, имеются две хорошо*

сохранившихся расписки, подтверждающие передачу продавцами прав собственности на рабов покупателям»²¹.

Согласно описи «Арх. 69», в 1918 г. в коллекцию В.И. Роборовского входили только три рукописных фрагмента на древнеуйгурском²² SI 4871–SI 4873 (Rob/2-Rob/4)²³. Описание коллекции Д.А. Клеменца в описи 1918 г. не представлено. Учитывая все вышеперечисленные факты, можно предположить, что часть древнеуйгурских фрагментов (наряду с фрагментами рукописей на других языках), привезенных Д.А. Клеменцом и В.И. Роборовским, либо были включены в состав других коллекций в связи с потерей сведений об их происхождении, либо никогда не передавались в АМ²⁴.

Первое предположение вполне правдоподобно, поскольку известно, что крупные фрагменты (в особенности те, на которых имелось достаточное количество текста для их перевода или даже идентификации сочинения) довольно часто хранились дома у исследователей, занимавшихся их разбором и изучением. Так, известно, что после смерти В.В. Радлова, К.Г. Залемана и С.Ф. Ольденбурга среди их личных бумаг были найдены рукописные фрагменты из собрания АМ. Такая общепринятая на тот момент практика нередко приводила к утрате информации об истории приобретения.

Например, фрагментам, хранившимся у В.В. Радлова, впоследствии были присвоены шифры **Kle.-Rob.**, и отделить те из них, которые были привезены В.И. Роборовским, от найденных Д.А. Клеменцем не представляется возможным. Пять фрагментов, приобретенных Д.А. Клеменцом и позднее, в 1928 г., опубликованных В.В. Радловым²⁵ с дополнениями С.Е. Малова в «Памятниках уйгурского языка» (USp: № 55²⁶, 56, 57, 58, 59), составляют редкое исключение. Более того, несколько фрагментов, опубликованных в 1928 г. под шифрами **Kle.-Rob.**, были обнаружены в коллекции с шифром **Uig** – «разные древнеуйгурские материалы». Другие, изданные в USp, сохранились в виде фотокопий, которые хранятся в фотографическом фонде ИВР²⁷.

В настоящее время в эту коллекцию включены два фрагмента *Махамаюривидьяраджнисутры* SI 4871–SI 4872 (Rob/2, Rob/3²⁸) и деловые документы под шифрами SI 4873 (Rob/4), SI 6544 (Uig/14), SI 6545 (Uig/15) и SI 6546 (Uig/16). С большой долей вероятности сюда же можно отнести три буддийских фрагмента SI 6540 (Uig/8, Uig/9), SI 6542 (Uig/11) и фрагмент документа на обороте китайского свитка SI 6539 (Uig/7).

Коллекция Кохановского (К)

Врач Российского консульства в Урумчи в 1904–1906 гг. Александр Иванович Кохановский²⁹ отправился в Турфан в 1906–1907 гг.³⁰. Поскольку он приобретал рукописные фрагменты у местных жителей, места их обнаружения неизвестны.

Согласно сохранившимся архивным документам, приобретенные А.И. Кохановским материалы были переданы в АМ 20 марта 1907 г. В описи «Арх. 69» упоминаются несколько фрагментов в 11 стеклянных рамках. Поскольку указания количества фрагментов и их описания отсутствуют, соотнести их с современными шифрами не представляется возможным.

В коллекцию Кохановского в настоящий момент входит 34 единицы хранения рукописей на древнеуйгурском языке. Подавляющее большинство — это мелкие и мельчайшие рукописные фрагменты с буддийскими текстами *SI 4904* (К/20), *SI 4906–SI 4908* (К/22–К/24), *SI 4910–SI 4913* (К/26–К/29), *SI 4914–SI 4918* (К/30), *SI 5879*, *SI 5885*, *SI 5887–SI 5890*, *SI 5892*, *SI 5915*, *SI 5995* (К/6), *SI 6148*, *SI 6168*, *SI 6193*, *SI 6215*, *SI 6219*, *SI 6277*, *SI 6349* (К/7), *SI 6593–SI 6595*, *SI 6598* (старые шифры отсутствуют) и один документ *SI 4909/1* (К/25а).

Коллекция Березовского (В)

Записи о поступлении коллекции Михаила Михайловича Березовского (1848–1912), возглавлявшего организованную РКСА экспедицию в район Кучи в 1905–1907 гг., в архивных материалах ИВР на данный момент не обнаружены. Однако можно предположить, что коллекция была передана в АМ в 1908–1909 гг.

Выдающийся исследователь Центральной Азии, зоолог и ботаник³¹ М.М. Березовский посетил Субаши, Долгудур-Охур, Таджит, Кумтуру, Кучу, Кызыл и Кириш. Привезенная им коллекция рукописных фрагментов имеет особую ценность: места их обнаружения практически всегда известны (места находок написаны на конвертах, в которых хранятся фрагменты), так как М.М. Березовский тщательно сортировал находки по этому принципу. Фрагменты рукописей на древнеуйгурском языке были найдены в месте Онбаш-минуй, расположенному недалеко от Кучи.

В настоящее время к этой коллекции относятся четыре уйгурских буддийских фрагмента книжным письмом *SI 2951* (В/22), 23 фрагмента курсивным письмом *SI 2952–2954* (В/23), *SI 2966* (В/30), упражнения в письме *SI 2964* (В/28) и три фрагмента с текстом, написанным курсивным наклонным брахми *SI 2965* (В/29) (санскрит-уйгурские билингвы)³².

Коллекция Дьякова (D)

Алексей Алексеевич Дьяков (1876–?), секретарь, а позднее и консул в Кульдже (1906–1912) и Урумчи (1913–1915), посетил город Астына (Турфандский оазис) 15–20 августа 1908 г. Из Астыны он привез крупный фрагмент древнеуйгурского ксилографа, два рукописных уйгурских свитка и 81 фрагмент, 70 из которых это фрагменты на древнеуйгурском³³. Эти материалы были переданы РКСА в АМ в декабре 1909 г.

Древнеуйгурская часть коллекции Дьякова включает цветной амулет с текстом *дхарани SI 3123* (D/5), фрагмент свитка *Авалокитешварасутры* (*Kuanši-im Pusar*) *SI 3158* (D/2), свиток с практически полным текстом³⁴ манихейского покаяния в грехах (*Хуастванифт*) *SI 3159* (D/1), 14 страниц ксилографического издания *Аватамсакасутры SI 4842* (D/3), 48 фрагментов *Суварнапрабхасасутры* (*Altun Yaruk*) *SI 4843* (D/4) и другие фрагменты неидентифицированных в настоящий момент буддийских текстов *SI 4844* (D/6), *SI 4846* (D/10), *SI 4845* (D/7), *SI 4850* (D/14-1), *SI 4854* (D/16), *SI 4857* (D/19), *SI 4860* (D/23), *SI 4861* (D/24a), *SI 4862* (D/24b), *SI 4863* (D/25) и деловых документов *SI 4847* (D/11), *SI 4848* (D/12), *SI 4849* (D/13), *SI 4851* (D/14-2), *SI 4852* (D/14-3), *SI 4853* (D/15), *SI 4855* (D/17), *SI 4856* (D/18), *SI 4858* (D/20, D/21), *SI 4859* (D/22).

Коллекция Кроткова (Kr)

Большая часть фрагментов рукописей и ксилографов на древнеуйгурском языке в Сериндийском фонде относится к коллекции Николая Николаевича Кроткова (1869–1919), российского консула в Урумчи, а затем секретаря консульств в Гирине, Цицикаре и Кульдже. Хорошо знакомый с историей и культурой Восточного Туркестана, Н.Н. Кротков не только покупал рукописные фрагменты у местных жителей, но также лично проводил археологические раскопки в окрестностях Урумчи, Туюк-мазара, Яр-хого и Гаочана. Приобретенные им материалы были переданы в АМ четырьмя отдельными партиями.

Так называемая «Первая коллекция Кроткова» прибыла в Санкт-Петербург в 1907 г. В сохранившихся протоколах РКСА сказано, что Н.Н. Кротков лично привез и представил Комитету приобретенные им фрагменты книг. К.Г. Залеман, тогдашний директор АМ, высоко оценил рукописную коллекцию и убедил Комитет приобрести ее за немалые по тем временам деньги, 5000 рублей, 4000 из которых были выделены из фонда археологических исследований Турфана. Эти материалы были переданы в АМ в 1908 г.

Уйгурская, уйгуро-китайская и согдийская части этой коллекции несколько раз перешифровывались³⁵. В итоге материалам из первой партии были присвоены следующие инвентарные номера: Kr I/1–Kr I/487, Kr II/1-1–Kr II/1-819, Kr II/2-1–Kr II/2-669, Kr II/3-1–Kr II/3-371, Kr II/4-1–Kr II/4-120, Kr II/5–Kr II/50, Kr III/1–Kr III/40, Kr IV/1–Kr IV/194, Kr.

Доп/1-6 (для уйгурских фрагментов, 11 из которых были написаны на оборотах китайских свитков), Kr IV/195–Kr IV/223 (для согдийских фрагментов).

Вторая часть коллекции была пожертвована РКСА Н.Н. Кротковым в 1909 г. Доставил ее в Петербург член Первой Русской Турфанскои экспедиции, возглавляемой С.Ф. Ольденбургом, В.И. Каменский, по причине болезни вынужденный вернуться в Россию. Судя по записям в инвентарных книгах ИВР РАН, рукописные фрагменты поступили в АМ осенью 1909 г. Позднее этим материалам были присвоены шифры: 2 Kr/1–2 Kr/90. Более того, известно, что 15 мая 1910 г. Н.Н. Кротков отдельным письмом прислал В.В. Радлову тринадцать страниц древнеуйгурской книги-«гармоники» *SI 5817 – SI 5818* (3 Kr/a-c)³⁶.

Третья часть коллекции, приобретенная РКСА за 2000 рублей, поступила в Комитет 28 марта 1911 г. Включенные в нее материалы имеют особую ценность, поскольку известны места их обнаружения. В сохранившихся архивных документах (Ф. 152, Оп. 1, ед. 52, л. 52) указано, что в РКСА была передана посылка, содержащая две тибетских рукописи, две тибетских и две китайских рукописи из Дуньхуана, а также сверток с древнеуйгурскими и китайскими фрагментами, обнаруженными в развалинах Яр-хото, два свертка из Хархаджи и один сверток с рукописными фрагментами, обнаруженными во время раскопок Туюк-мазара³⁷.

Несколько месяцев спустя, летом 1911 г., Н.Н. Кротков лично привез последнюю, четвертую часть коллекции в Петербург и передал ее в Комитет. По всей вероятности, материалы, включенные во вторую и третью посылки, были отобраны лично Н.Н. Кротковым. Судя по всему, он сначала отправил в РКСА наиболее крупные и показавшиеся ему наиболее интересными фрагменты. Это подтверждается, в первую очередь, наличием в четвертой части коллекции фрагментов, которые можно присоединить к рукописным фрагментам, отосланным ранее³⁸.

Список материалов из третьей и четвертой партий в описи 1918 г. позволяет предположить, что переданы они были в промежутке между 1911 и 1917 гг. В.В. Радловым, который занимался предварительным разбором уйгурских материалов из коллекции Н.Н. Кроткова.

Судя по отдельным архивным записям и пометкам на полях рукописных фрагментов, В.В. Радлов отобрал наиболее крупные и интересные с научной точки зрения уйгурские фрагменты и присвоил им шифры 3 Kr/1–3 Kr/50, 4a Kr/1–4a Kr/76, 4b Kr/1–4b Kr/23. Оставшиеся фрагменты четвертой коллекции разбирали уже сотрудники АМ после 1918 г.: им были присвоены шифры 4b Kr/24–4b Kr/236, Kr IV/224–Kr IV/879³⁹. Фотокопии

уйгурских фрагментов с шифрами 3 Kr/26–3 Kr/50 были переданы в АМ С.Е. Маловым в 1928 г., после издания USp⁴⁰.

В коллекцию Кроткова входят 4454 единицы хранения древнеуйгурских текстов. Более 800 фрагментов – древнеуйгурские тексты, написанные на оборотной стороне китайских свитков, 28 – на оборотной стороне согдийских рукописей. Шифры SI 6603–SI 6613 представляют собой одиннадцать листов мелинекса, в которые помещены 530 мелких фрагментов уйгурских рукописей. Являясь самой объемной из всех коллекций Сериндийского фонда, коллекция Кроткова включает как переводные буддийские и апокрифические тексты, так и оригинальные деловые документы.

Один древнеуйгурский документ, переданный Н.Н. Кротковым, хранится в Монгольском фонде ИВР под шифром G 120⁴¹.

Коллекция Ольденбурга (О)

Сергей Федорович Ольденбург (1863–1934), выдающийся русский востоковед, директор АМ–ИВ АН с 1916 по 1934 гг., привез многочисленные фрагменты рукописей на различных языках и системах письма Центральной Азии из Первой (1909–1910 гг.) и Второй Русских Туркестанских экспедиций (1914–1915 гг.). Носившая разведочный характер, Первая Русская Туркестанская экспедиция под руководством С.Ф. Ольденбурга проводила раскопки в северных оазисах Восточного Туркестана: Карапаре, Турфане и Куче, где были исследованы около десятка наземных и пещерных буддийских храмов⁴².

В результате несколько сотен рукописных фрагментов были привезены в Санкт-Петербург. И хотя фрагменты (по большей части обнаруженные в Безеклике, Идыкутшари, Туюк-мазаре и Чиктиме, расположенных в Турфанском оазисе) имели особую научную ценность, сам С.Ф. Ольденбург был глубоко разочарован количеством и состоянием своих находок. Выдающийся русский индолог Ф.И. Щербатской (1866–1942) писал по этому поводу: «*В результате, когда экспедиция, возглавляемая С.Ф. [Ольденбургом] двинулась в путь, страна уже была посещена целым рядом экспедиций, которые буквально опустошили край в археологическом отношении. Русской экспедиции, прибывшей на место после других, оставалось только констатировать такое положение и вернуться домой почти с пустыми руками*»⁴³.

В настоящий момент в коллекцию Ольденбурга входит 102 единицы хранения на древнеуйгурском языке *SI 3114/1* (O/66), *SI 3116/3* (O/7c), *SI 3161* (O/49a-d), *SI 3162* (O/50), *SI 4586* (O/2-6), *SI 4603* (O/3-9,1–O/3-9,2)–*SI 4605* (O/3-9,4), *SI 4609* (O/4-4), *SI 4620* (O/5-10,1), *SI 4621* (O/5-10,2), *SI 4624* (O/6-2), *SI 4664* (O/15-1)–*SI 4667* (O/15-4), *SI 4671* (O/15-8), *SI 4679* (O/16-4в)–*SI 4685* (O/16-9), *SI 4686* (O/29)–*SI 4688* (O/31), *SI 4691* (O/36)–*SI 4693* (O/38), *SI 4695* (O/41)–*4713* (O/48a-d), *SI 4614* (O/51), *SI 4716* (/54)–*SI 4717* (O/55), *SI 4718* (O/73), *SI 4720* (O/76), *SI 4724* (O/26), *SI 4725* (O/56)–*SI 4732* (O/63), *SI 4735* (O/70), *SI 4738* (O/77a)–*SI 4765* (O/105), *SI 4768* (O/109), *SI 4776* (O/113a-b)–*SI 4777* (O/113c), *SI 4820* (O/39)–*SI 4823* (O/40c), *SI 4824* (O/48d), *SI 4836* (O/198), *SI 6560*. Скорее всего, именно С.Ф. Ольденбургом были привезены фрагменты без указания фондообразователя, зарегистрированные как «Фрагменты из Туюк-мазара, 1909». Сейчас это собрание исследуется, и на данный момент инвентаризировано 60 древнеуйгурских фрагментов, 35 из которых написаны на обороте китайских свитков (*SI 6677*, *SI 6678*, *SI 6619*–*SI 6676*). Большая часть коллекции С.Ф. Ольденбурга представлена мельчайшими фрагментами, в связи с чем идентифицировать тексты не представляется возможным. Подавляющее большинство крупных уйгурских фрагментов – это буддийские тексты и деловые документы (*SI 4716* (O/54), *SI 4717* (O/55), *SI 4718* (O/73), *SI 4735* (O/70), *SI 4820* (O/39), *SI 4747* (O/89)).

Помимо этого, четыре рукописных фрагмента, обнаруженные С.Ф. Ольденбургом, были изданы В.В. Радловым под шифрами O/1⁴⁴ and O/2⁴⁵.

Коллекция Петровского (Р)

Николай Федорович Петровский (1837–1908) – российский консул, внесший огромный вклад в изучение Восточного Туркестана. Став консулом в Кашгаре в 1882 г., он начал активно собирать рукописи и предметы искусства, приобретая их у местных жителей в Куче, Корле и Аксу и проводя археологические раскопки в Куче. В 1892–1893 гг. Н.Ф. Петровский отправил С.Ф. Ольденбургу более 100 листов и фрагментов рукописей, купленных у местного населения. В 1905 г. он передал в дар РКСА свою туркестанскую коллекцию, позднее поступившую в АМ. Согласно архивным материалам, часть найденных им рукописей были куплены у его вдовы, С.А. Петровской, за 1300 рублей⁴⁶.

Коллекция Петровского включает 582 единицы хранения, четыре из которых – рукописи на древнеуйгурском: два фрагмента курсивным письмом *SI 1924* (Р/132), *SI 3629* (Р/125з) и два документа на дереве *SI 3660* (Р/137д), *SI 3671* (Р/1406).

Коллекция Малова (М, MA)

В 1909–1911 и 1913–1914 гг. Сергей Ефимович Малов (1880–1957) совершил поездки в Восточный Туркестан и северо-восточный (Чугучак, Урумчи, Турфан, Хара-ходжа, Хами, Суджоу) и Центральный Китай (Лобнор, Аксу, Яркенд, Хотан, Кашгар). Его экспедиции имели целью не столько археологические, сколько этнографические и лингвистические исследования малоизученных тюркских народов. С.Е. Маловым были собраны обширные этнографические коллекции среди сарыг-уйголов, саларов, лобнорцев, уйголов и других народов Восточного Туркестана (переданы в Музей антропологии и этнографии им. Петра Великого (Кунсткамера) в 1925 г.). Кроме того, им было сделано большое количество фотоснимков, часть которых в настоящий момент хранится в ИВР РАН. В экспедициях С.Е. Малову удалось приобрести множество фрагментов рукописей и документов на древнеуйгурском и других языках, в т.ч. хотаносакском, санскрите, монгольском⁴⁷, тибетском⁴⁸ и китайском.

Большая часть собранных им материалов, по устоявшейся традиции, была передана РКСА в АМ. Часть рукописных фрагментов, переданных вместе с этнографической коллекцией С.Е. Малова в Музей антропологии и этнографии, поступили в АМ только в 1925 г.

Фрагменты древнеуйгурского ксилографического издания *Ситатапатра-дхарани SI 4502* (M/5) и два документа из Турфана *SI 4503* (M/6), *SI 4504* (M/7), приобретенных во время второй экспедиции в Китай, С.Е. Малов передал лично в 1952 г. Несколько фрагментов поступили в Сериндийский фонд после его смерти. Фрагменты, обнаруженные в его личном архиве, получили шифры MA в процессе инвентаризации 1994 г.

В коллекцию Малова входят 24 единицы хранения на древнеуйгурском языке: *SI 4498–SI 4504* (M/1–M/7), *SI 4559–SI 4575* (MA/1–MA/11-4). Особенно следует отметить уникальную уйгурсую рукопись «Алтун ярук» («Сутра золотого блеска») *SI 4498* (M/1), *SI 4500* (M/3) и примыкающее к ней «Благословление» (Buyan ävirmäk) *SI 4499* (M/2), приобретенные С.Е. Маловым во время его первой экспедиции в храме Вэнъчжоу коу (文珠口)⁴⁹ недалеко от города Сучжоу (провинция Ганьсу, КНР).

Коллекция Козлова (Koz)

В 1907–1909 гг. значительное количество рукописей и ксилографов на разных языках были обнаружены русским путешественником и исследователем Центральной Азии Петром Кузьмичом Козловым (1863–1935) в развалинах «мертвого» города Хара-Хото. В

коллекцию Козлова, хранящуюся в Сериндийском фонде, входит один фрагмент на древнеуйгурском языке *SI 4841* (Koz/5)⁵⁰.

Материалы из разных коллекций (Uig)

Коллекция **Uig** древнеуйгурских материалов из разных коллекций включает 27 единиц хранения *SI 3156* (Uig/3), *SI 3157* (Uig/12), *SI 5066* (Uig/19), *SI 6534–6557* (Uig/1–Uig/2, Uig/4–Uig/11, Uig/13–Uig/18). По всей вероятности, этот шифр создали для фрагментов, история приобретения которых была неизвестна на момент их включения, или единичных фрагментов, переданных исследователями.

Так, шифры Uig/1 и Uig/2 (в настоящий момент *SI 6534* и *SI 6535*) получили чагатайские памятники уйгурским письмом – официальные документы XV в., привезенные В.В. Бартольдом в 1902 г. из Маргилана (Ферганская область Узбекистана). В данную коллекцию также включили *SI 5066* (Uig/19), *SI 6547–SI 6553* (Uig/17), *SI 6554 – SI 6557* (Uig/18) – мелкие фрагменты манихейского содержания и фрагменты рисунков на ткани и бумаге.

История происхождения остальных единиц хранения восстанавливается с достаточной определенностью. Как было указано ранее, *SI 6544* (Uig/14), *SI 6545* (Uig/15), *SI 6545* (Uig/16) относятся к коллекциям В.И. Роборовского и Д.А. Клеменца. К этим же коллекциям предположительно можно отнести *SI 6539* (Uig/7), *SI 6540* (Uig/8, Uig/9), *SI 6542* (Uig/11).

До самого недавнего времени загадкой оставались подробности приобретения уникальных рукописей «Биографии Сюань-цзана» *SI 3156* (Uig/3), *SI 6538* (Uig/6) и «Сутры общины Белого лотоса» *SI 6536–SI 6537* (Uig/4–Uig/5). Работа с архивными материалами ИВР РАН показала, что эти рукописные фрагменты поступили в Институт Востоковедения в 1932 г. от заведующего Вторым восточным отделом НКИД СССР Б.И. Козловского⁵¹.

Инвентаризация и изучение древнеуйгурских фрагментов

Инвентаризовались фрагменты рукописей и ксилографических изданий на древнеуйгурском языке, как правило, в порядке их поступления в коллекцию АМ. С самого начала в задачи АМ входило не только хранение и инвентаризация материалов, но и введение их в научный оборот и каталогизация⁵², которая бы сделала их более доступными для научного сообщества. Согласно архивным материалам (Ф. 152, оп. 1а, ед. 61 – выписка из протокола ИФО от 11 января 1917 г.), в 1917 г. С.Ф. Ольденбург

собирался поручить работу по сортировке материалов С.Е. Малову: «*Директор Азиатского Музея просил разрешения поручить С.Е. Малову составление описи уйгурских рукописей Азиатского Музея на тех же основаниях, на каких составляет описание монгольских рукописей Б.Я. Владимицов. При этом Директор Азиатского Музея сообщил, что академик В.В. Радлов любезно изъявил согласие принять на себя наблюдение за составлением описи*». Революция 1917 г. и последовавшие за ней события помешали воплотить эти намерения в жизнь.

Тем не менее, стоит отметить, что изучение фрагментов древнеуйгурских рукописей и ксилографов началось вскоре после их передачи в АМ. Значительная часть материалов была опубликована уже в первой половине XX в. выдающимися тюркологами В.В. Радловым и С.Е. Маловым. Они издали наиболее «объемные» фрагменты: манихейское покаяние в грехах *Хуастванифт*⁵³, уйгурсскую версию *Дишаствустик* (Санскр. *Diśāsauvāstikasūtra*)⁵⁴, *Авалокитешвара-сутру* или 25 главу китайского перевода *Саддхарманударика-сутры* (Кuanši-im Pusar)⁵⁵, *Суварнапрабхасоттама-сутры* (Altun Yaruk)⁵⁶, а также многочисленные фрагменты буддийских сочинений и деловые документы⁵⁷.

После смерти В.В. Радлова в АМ не было специалиста по древнеуйгурскому языку. С.Е. Малов не являлся сотрудником ни АМ, ни ИВ, но оказывал помощь в инвентаризации и идентификации фрагментов. На это указывают многочисленные записи, хранящиеся вместе с фрагментами Сериндийского фонда. Об этом факте упоминает также Л.В. Дмитриева в обзорной статье, посвященной древнеуйгурской части коллекции фонда⁵⁸. Благодаря С.Е. Малову в ИВ также были переданы фотокопии уникальных фрагментов, которые были изданы в USp.

Исследования древнеуйгурских материалов возобновились только в 1960-е г. Л.В. Дмитриева (1924–1997) переиздала *Хуастванифт*. Л.Ю. Тугушева опубликовала пятый, шестой, восьмой и десятый разделы «Биографии Сюань-цзана»⁵⁹, а также другие фрагменты буддийских текстов и деловые документы. Позднее была издана уйгурская

версия *Дашакармапатхаваданамала* (в соавторстве с Масахиро Сёгайто)⁶⁰, «Сутра общины Белого лотоса»⁶¹, переизданы *Хуастванифт* и документы XI–IX вв.⁶².

Значительный вклад в изучение древнеуйгурских фрагментов Сериндийского фонда внесли иностранные ученые. Усилиями европейских (П. Циме, Г. Кара, С.-К. Рашманн, А. Якуб) и японских исследователей (М. Сёгайто, Ю. Ода, Д. Мацуй, Х. Умэмура, К. Кицудо) были изданы уйгурские фрагменты буддийских текстов и документов.

В 2002 г. Х. Умэмура, М. Сёгайто, Ю. Ёсида и А. Якуб опубликовали «Предварительный каталог микрофильмов уйгурских, согдийских и манихейских рукописей Санкт-Петербургского филиала ИВ РАН». Однако, каталог не получил широкого распространения в научных кругах⁶³.

Настоящее издание является результатом научного сотрудничества исследователей ИВР РАН и Тоё Бунко в рамках соглашения, подписанного весной 1996 г. между Санкт-Петербургским отделением Института востоковедения Российской Академии наук и Тоё Бунко⁶⁴. Каталог включает описание 564 древнеуйгурских фрагментов. Авторы каталога надеются, что каталог, воплощенный в жизнь совместными усилиями сотрудников ИВР РАН и Тоё Бунко, станет лишь началом и толчком к последующим исследованиям древнеуйгурских материалов института.

Цель представленного научному сообществу каталога – сделать древнеуйгурскую часть Сериндийского фонда ИВР РАН доступной для специалистов. Надеемся, что этот и последующие тома каталога, наряду с изданиями неопубликованных фрагментов, позволят получить более целостное представление о роли древнеуйгурской культуры в истории Центральной Азии, с момента образования Уйгурского каганата до эпохи Юань.

Serindia collection of the IOM, RAS⁶⁵

Although the Old Uyghur scriptural tradition had a history of several hundred years (9th–17th cc.), it remained unknown to European scholars until the late of the 19th century. The first Western scholar to note the existence of texts in Old Turkic, was Stanislas Julien (1797–1873) in 1849. He mentioned this fact while working on a catalogue of the Chinese Tripitaka, prepared under the auspices of Khubilai Khan in 1285–1287⁶⁶. His observation was subsequently confirmed during the famous Silk Road expeditions of the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when a vast cache of Old Uyghur Buddhist texts and secular documents were discovered in East Turkestan (modern Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region 新疆, PRC) and Dunhuang 敦煌 in the Gansu 甘肃 region of China.

The first Old Uyghur manuscripts and blockprints were discovered during the Russian Turfan expedition headed by Vsevolod I. Roborovsky in 1893–1895. These fragments along with the others in different languages and scripts subsequently acquired by Russian officials Nikolai F. Petrovsky and Nikolai N. Krotkov and expeditions headed by Sergei F. Oldenburg in 1909–1910 and 1914–1915 and Sergei E. Malov in 1909–1911 and 1913–1914, formed the so called Serindia (formerly known as Central Asian) collection kept nowadays at the IOM, RAS.

The Serindia collection could be considered one of the most exclusive manuscript collections of the Institute as it is very diversified in terms of languages and dates. It contains 6737 items⁶⁷ in thirteen languages (Sanskrit, Gāndhārī Prakrit, Tocharian A and B (Kuchean), Khotan Saka, Sogdian, Middle Persian (Pahlavi), Old Uyghur, Chinese, Tibetan, Mongolian, Arabic, and Tumshuqese Saka).

The history of this collection, the formation of which was closely related to the activities of prominent Russian explorers of Central Asia, archaeologists, linguists and diplomats, is still insufficiently studied, and a lot of facts require clarification. The first manuscripts that nowadays belong to the collection were transferred to the Asiatic Museum (AM) in 1892. However as a separate unit the collection was mentioned only in 1953, when the first inventory list of book fragments from Central Asia was compiled.

The name of the collection had been changed from ‘Central Asian’ to ‘Serindia’ by Margarita I. Vorobyova-Desyatovskaya in May 2006, when the decision to assign new call numbers ‘SI’⁶⁸ was made. The new call numbers of separately preserved at that time

subcollections primarily aimed to assist library work and make the collection more easily available to the researchers.

Nowadays the Serindia collection includes 15 subcollections of different size and content⁶⁹, 13 of which bear the names of the acquirers. It was Sergei F. Oldenburg who decided to systemize the materials this way. Originally these subcollections were kept under the following codes: **B** for Berezovsky; **D** — Dyakov; **Kl** — Klementz; **Koz** — Kozlov; **K** — Kokhanovsky; **Kol** — Kolokolov; **Kr** — Krotkov; **L** — Lavrov; **M, MA, Мтд** — Malov; **O** — Oldenburg; **P** — Petrovsky; **Rob** — Roborovsky; **Strel-D** — Strelkov. Subcollection **Uig** mainly includes miscellaneous texts in Old Uyghur script that were sorted into a separate unit due to the unknown provenance. One manuscript, discovered in 1965 at the Merv Oasis not far from Bairam-Ali in Turkmenistan, is preserved separately under call number **Merv**. Moreover, 51 fragments do not belong to any subcollection as their initial call numbers are unknown, thus, it is impossible to determine the provenance.

While provenance of some items discovered during archaeological excavations is clear, the origin of the major part of the book fragments purchased from the inhabitants and treasure-seekers of Turfan remains a mystery. The collection endured several relocations within Petrograd–Leningrad (now St. Petersburg), when the Institute (former AM⁷⁰) changed its location. During the Russian Civil War (1917–1921) the manuscript collection was transferred to Saratov⁷¹. Packed away, it survived during World War II in the basement of the Library of the Russian Academy of Sciences in Leningrad. And although the physical impact of these transfers was insignificant, information about the provenance and acquisition time of some items (especially those that had not been listed in the inventory books by that time) was lost. Nowadays efforts are undertaken to recover these data.

One should mention that more than 300 Old Uyghur fragments are also kept in the Dunhuang collection under call numbers **Дх**. The provenance of these fragments requires further research. It is well-known that the major part of the materials included in this collection was obtained by Sergei F. Oldenburg during the Second Russian Turkestan expedition (1914–1915), that surveyed the Mogao Caves at Dunhuang and revisited some of the sites in Turfan. The expedition discovered a large number of artefacts and manuscript fragments (nearly 20000) at

Dunhuang, and also purchased about 300 scrolls from local people. However, nowadays it is obvious that some Old Uyghur, Mongolian and Tibetan fragments were transferred from the other Institute's collections, apparently, before the World War II⁷².

Provenance, acquisition and processing of Old Uyghur fragments in the Serindia collection

The major part, 4730 items of the Serindia collection, appear to be book fragments in the so-called Old Turkic or Old Uyghur language. Obtained during expeditions to Eastern Turkestan organized by the Russian Geographical Society (RGS), Russian Archaeological Society (RAS) and Russian Committee for Middle and East Asia Exploration (RCMA) at the turn of the 20th century, book fragments in Old Uyghur script according to the customary tradition were transferred to the AM. While some manuscripts were given to the AM almost at the same time they were brought to St. Petersburg, for others it took several decades to be included in the collection⁷³.

The history of formation and processing of the book fragments in Old Uyghur language remains unrecognised except for a few publications⁷⁴ and contains a few gaps that will probably never be filled with complete confidence. However, some archival documents (inventory books⁷⁵, archival documents from the Archives of Orientalists⁷⁶, RCMA's transactions, private papers of the people engaged in manuscripts acquisition, and manuscript register lists⁷⁷) can shed light on the general history of the Old Uyghur part of the Serindia collection.

Roborovsky and Klementz subcollection (Rob., Kle.-Rob., Uig)

The first attempt to systematize the manuscripts and printed books of the AM collections dates back to 1918–1920 when AM researchers compiled and published a booklet “The Asiatic Museum of the Russian Academy of Sciences. 1818–1918. Summary”. According to the prominent Russian Turkologist, director of the IOS, AS USSR from 1934 to 1937, Aleksander N. Samoilovich, who was in charge of the Turkic part of the AM collection at that time, “*the [Old] Uyghur manuscripts were absent in the [collection of the] Asiatic Museum at the moment of its foundation and much later... The first accessions were manuscript fragments acquired in Eastern Turkestan in 1897 by [V.I.] Roborovsky and P.K. Kozlov and [later]*

*transferred to the Museum by the Russian Geographical Society. ... Subsequent [Old] Uyghur materials were brought by D.A. Klementz' expedition to Turfan in 1898*⁷⁸.

Vsevolod Ivanovich Roborovsky (1856–1910), a participant of the third and fourth Przhevalsky's expeditions to Central Asia, headed the expedition organized by the RGS to Eastern Turkestan and North-Western China in 1893–1895. Although the expedition was not expected to be an archaeological one, Vsevolod I. Roborovsky managed to obtain a number of manuscript fragments in different scripts, *inter alia* in Old Uyghur. According to his travel records, he purchased several scrolls of large size (approximately 30 cm wide and up to 280 cm long) from the local people near the ruins of Idikut Shari, the former residence of the rulers of the Kocho kingdom: “...While digging the ruins, the Changtu often find various household utensils used by former residents, the Uyghurs, e.g. old ceramic vessels, different glass ornaments, silver and copper coins and numerous manuscripts. I managed to acquire samples of these objects. The purchased scrolls were up to a foot wide and up to four arshin long”⁷⁹.

“...in 1896, the IRGS received a bag containing fragments of Chinese and Old Uyghur manuscripts picked up or purchased in various localities of the Turfan Oasis, most probably in Idikut Shari and Toyuk Mazar, by V.I. Roborovsky and P.K. Kozlov's expedition to Middle Asia in 1894–1895... S.F. Oldenburg together with A.O. Ivanovsky sorted out the contents of the bag and identified fragments of Chinese, Uyghur, Sanskrit and bilingual Uyghur-Sanskrit manuscripts. The materials were handed over to W.W. Radloff, who, intrigued by them, presented a paper to the Academy of Sciences”⁸⁰.

Later, Wilhelm Radloff described the obtained Old Uyghur materials in his article “Altugurische Sprachproben aus Turfan”: “Im December 1897 wurden mir eine Anzahl beschriebener Papierfetzen übergeben, die die russischen Reisenden Roborovski und Kozlov aus Turfan nach St. Petersburg gebracht und der Kaiserlichen Russischen Geographischen Gesellschaft übergeben hatten. Eine genauere Prüfung dieser Schriftfragmente ergab folgendes Resultat: die meisten Schriftstücke enthielten türkische mit uigurischen Buchstaben geschriebene Texte, die nach den Schriftzügen und dem für dieselben verwendeten Papier zu urtheilen, in zwei scharf geschiedene Gruppen zu theilen waren. Die erste Gruppe war auf einer Seite eines sehr dünnen roh und ungleichmäßig verarbeiteten Papiers geschrieben; die Schriftzüge waren in rundlichem Duktus mit dem Pinsel leicht hingeworfen und machten den Eindruck einer Schnellschrift, wie sie nur bei geschäftlichen Schriften verwendet werden konnte”⁸¹.

These ‘unintentional’ finds by Roborovsky's expedition aroused so much interest that the Imperial Academy of Sciences sent a special expedition headed by Dmitry A. Klementz to the region⁸². A Russian explorer of Middle and Eastern Asia, archaeologist, and initiator of the first Russian expeditions to the Tarim Basin, Dmitry Aleksandrovich Klementz (1848–1914) visited Turfan (Idikut Shari and Toyuk Mazar) in 1898. Although he personally deemed that

manuscripts, acquired in Kharakhoja during the expedition were insignificant⁸³, Wilhelm Radloff highly appreciated his finds⁸⁴: “Diese Schriftdenkmäler bestehen aus fünf Kategorien: 1) Abklatsche von an den Wänden einer Höhlenwohnung eingekratzten alttürkischen Inschriften; 2) Stücke vom Stuck der Klosterhöhlen, auf denen sich mit schwarzer oder braunrother Farbe geschriebene uigurische Inschriften befinden; 3) Fragmente buddhistischer religiöser Handschriften; 4) Fragmente von in Holzdruck ausgeführten buddhistischen Büchern; 5) Geschäftliche Schriftstücke in uigurischer Sprache. Die letzteren Schriftstücke haben für uns einen ganz besonderen Werth, weil sie einige abgeschlossene Dokumente enthalten, die bis auf wenige Stellen sich intakt erhalten haben und leicht entzifferbar sind. Ausser mehreren nur theilweise erhaltenen Stücken befinden sich zwei gut erhaltene Bescheinigungen, in denen die Verkäufer von Sklaven den Käufern die Bestätigung des Besitzrechtes ausstellen”⁸⁵.

According to the register list ‘Arch. 69’, the Roborovsky subcollection included only three Old Uyghur manuscript fragments (SI 4871–4873 (Rob/2-Rob/4))⁸⁶ in 1918⁸⁷. Dmitry A. Klementz collection is not listed in this register list from 1918. Taking these facts into consideration, one can assume that the Old Uyghur fragments brought by Dmitry A. Klementz and Vsevolod I. Roborovsky (along with the manuscript fragments in other languages) either were included in the other subcollections due to the provenance loss, or were never transferred to the AM⁸⁸.

The first assumption is rather plausible as it is well-known that fragments of larger size (in particular those that had enough text for translation or even identification of the text title) were quite often kept by the researchers for private use. This is primarily proven by the fact that manuscript fragments were found among private papers of the AM directors Wilhelm Radloff, Carl H. Salemann and Sergei F. Oldenburg after they passed away. This customary practice sometimes resulted in provenance loss.

Thus, fragments kept by Wilhelm Radloff later obtained the code **Kle.-Rob.**, and it is impossible to associate them with any of the explorers. Five fragments acquired by Dmitry A. Klementz, later published by Wilhelm Radloff⁸⁹ with additions by Sergei E. Malov in USp (# 55⁹⁰, 56, 57, 58, 59), are a rare exception. Moreover, several fragments that had been published in 1928 under call numbers **Kle.-Rob.** were later discovered in subcollection of miscellaneous

Old Uyghur materials **Uig**. The others, edited in USp, are preserved in Photo collection of the IOM, RAS⁹¹.

Nowadays only two fragments of the *Mahāmāyūrīvidyārājñīsūtra* SI 4871–4872 (Rob/2, Rob/3⁹²) and the Old Uyghur documents SI 4873 (Rob/4), SI 6544 (Uig/14), SI 6545 (Uig/15) and SI 6546 (Uig/16) could be assigned to this subcollection with certainty. There is also a probability that the three Buddhist fragments SI 6540 (Uig/8, Uig/9), SI 6542 (Uig/11) and the fragment of a document on the reverse side of the Chinese scroll SI 6539 (Uig/7) belong to this subcollection.

Kokhanovsky subcollection (K)

Medical officer of the consulate in Urumchi from 1904 to 1906, Aleksander Ivanovich Kokhanovsky⁹³ went to Turfan in 1906–1907⁹⁴. As he purchased manuscript fragments from the local people their provenance is unknown.

According to the archival materials, the acquired manuscript fragments were transferred to the AM on March 20, 1907. The register list “Arch. 69” mentions several fragments preserved in 11 glass frames. The total number of fragments is not indicated; thus, it seems it is not possible to identify them among the modern call numbers.

The Kokhanovsky subcollection includes 34 items in Old Uyghur. The majority of fragments are of small size and include Buddhist texts SI 4904 (K/20), SI 4906–4908 (K/22–K/24), SI 4910–4913 (K/26–K/29), SI 4914–4918 (K/30), SI 5879, SI 5885, SI 5887–5890, SI 5892, SI 5915, SI 5995 (K/6), SI 6148, SI 6168, SI 6193, SI 6215, SI 6219, SI 6277, SI 6349 (K/7), SI 6593–6595, SI 6598 (no former call numbers) and one secular document SI 4909/I (K/25a).

Berezovsky subcollection (B)

Records of acquisition of the manuscript fragments collection obtained by Mikhail Mikhailovich Berezovsky’s (1848–1912) expedition to Kucha in 1905–1907 have not been yet discovered in the IOM archival materials. However, it is possible to assume that it happened in 1908–1909.

A prominent explorer of Central Asia, zoologist and biologist⁹⁵, Mikhail M. Berezovsky visited Subashi, Duldur-akhur, Tajit, Kumtura, Kucha, Kizil and Kirish. Manuscript fragments acquired by Mikhail M. Berezovsky are of special value due to the precise indication of the places where they were found (fragments were packed in envelopes inscribed with the names of sites). Thus, it is known that Old Uyghur fragments were also found in On-bash Ming-oi, located near Kucha.

The Berezovsky subcollection includes four Old Uyghur Buddhist fragments in calligraphic script SI 2951 (B/22), 23 fragments of unidentified texts in cursive script SI 2952–2954 (B/23),

SI 2966 (B/30), scribal exercises *SI* 2964 (B/28) and three fragments with text written in slanting Brāhmī *SI* 2965/1, 2, 3 (B/29) (Sanskrit-Old Uyghur bilinguals)⁹⁶.

Dyakov subcollection (D)

It is known that Aleksei Alekseevich Dyakov (1876–?), secretary of the Consulate and later consul in Kulja (1906–1912) and Urumchi (1913–1915), visited the site of Astana in Turfan oasis on August 15–20, 1908. There he managed to acquire a large fragment of a blockprint and two manuscript scrolls and 81 manuscript fragments, 70 of which appeared to be in Old Uyghur⁹⁷. These materials were transferred by the RCMA to the AM in December 1909.

The Old Uyghur part of the subcollection includes a coloured amulet with *dhāranī* text *SI* 3123 (D/5), a scroll fragment of the *Avalokiteśvarasūtra* (Kuanši-im Pusar) *SI* 3158 (D/2), almost a complete scroll⁹⁸ of the Manichean confession of sins (X^uastvanift) *SI* 3159 (D/1), 14 folios of the blockprint edition of *Avataṃsakasūtra* *SI* 4842 (D/3), 48 manuscript fragments of *Suvarṇaprabhāsottamasūtra* (Altun Yaruk) *SI* 4843 (D/4) and other unidentified Buddhist texts *SI* 4844 (D/6), *SI* 4846 (D/10), *SI* 4845 (D/7), *SI* 4850 (D/14-1), *SI* 4854 (D/16), *SI* 4857 (D/19), *SI* 4860 (D/23), *SI* 4861 (D/24a), *SI* 4862 (D/24b), *SI* 4863 (D/25) and secular documents *SI* 4847 (D/11), *SI* 4848 (D/12), *SI* 4849 (D/13), *SI* 4851 (D/14-2), *SI* 4852 (D/14-3), *SI* 4853 (D/15), *SI* 4855 (D/17), *SI* 4856 (D/18), *SI* 4858 (D/20, D/21), *SI* 4859 (D/22).

Krotkov subcollection (Kr)

The majority of Old Uyghur manuscript and blockprint fragments in the Serindia collection belong to the subcollection granted by Nikolai Nikolaevich Krotkov (1869–1919), consul in Urumchi and later secretary of the consulate in Girin, Tsitsikar and Kulja. Being an expert in Eastern Turkestan history and culture, Nikolai N. Krotkov not only purchased numerous manuscript fragments from the local people, but also carried out archaeological excavations in the vicinities of Urumchi, Toyuk Mazar, Yar-khoto and Gaochang. The materials that he managed to obtain were transferred to the AM in four separate parcels.

The so-called ‘First Krotkov collection’ was brought to St. Petersburg in 1907. According to the RCMA meeting records, Nikolai N. Krotkov brought the acquired book fragments and presented them to the Committee in person. Carl H. Salemann, director of the AM at that time, highly regarded the collection and persuaded the Committee to purchase it for an enormous sum of 5000 rubles, 4000 of which were paid from Turfan excavation funds. These materials became part of the AM holdings in 1908.

Call numbers of manuscript fragments in Old Uyghur and Sogdian were changed several times⁹⁹. Finally this part of the collection obtained call numbers Kr I/1–Kr I/487, Kr II/1-1–Kr II/1-819, Kr II/2-1–Kr II/2-669, Kr II/3-1–Kr II/3-371, Kr II/4-1–Kr II/4-120, Kr II/5–Kr II/50,

Kr III/1–Kr III/40, Kr IV/1–Kr IV/194, Kr. Доп/1–6 (for Old Uyghur fragments, 11 of which are written on the reverse side of the Chinese scrolls), Kr IV/195–Kr IV/223 (for Sogdian fragments).

The second part of the collection that had been contributed by Nikolai N. Krotkov to RCMA was brought to St. Petersburg in 1909 by Vladimir I. Kamensky, a member of the first Russian Turkestan expedition headed by Sergei F. Oldenburg, who had to return to Russia due to illness. According to the records found in the IOM inventory books, manuscript fragments were transferred to the AM in autumn 1909 and later were given the call numbers 2 Kr/1–2 Kr/90. In addition, on May 15, 1910, thirteen folios of an Old Uyghur concertina-style book *SI 5817–5818* (3 Kr/a-c) were sent by Nikolai N. Krotkov in a separate parcel to Wilhelm Radloff¹⁰⁰.

The RCMA purchased the third part of the collection for 2000 rubles and received it on March 28, 1911. These materials could be considered to be of special value as the provenance is known. According to the preserved archival documents (Archives of Orientalists, Coll. 152, Inv. 1, item 52, f. 52), the RCMA received a parcel that included two Tibetan manuscripts, two Tibetan and two Chinese manuscripts from Dunhuang, a package with Old Uyghur and Chinese manuscript fragments found in the Yar-khoto ruins, two — from Kharakhoja, and one package with manuscript fragments acquired during excavations in Toyuk Mazar¹⁰¹.

Several months later, in the summer of 1911, Nikolai N. Krotkov brought the last, forth part of his collection to St. Petersburg and granted it to the Committee. It seems probable that materials included in the second and third parcels were sorted by Nikolai N. Krotkov personally. One may assume that he primarily selected manuscript fragments of larger size and those that seemed more interesting to be sent to the RCMA. Thus, fragments from the last part of his collection can be jointed with those that were sent earlier¹⁰².

Records concerning the third and the last parts of Nikolai N. Krotkov's collection are found in the register list from 1918. One may suppose that these materials were transferred between 1911 and 1917 by Wilhelm Radloff, who was engaged in sorting the Old Uyghur collection of Nikolai N. Krotkov.

According to the archival materials and pencil notes in the margins of the manuscript fragments, Wilhelm Radloff selected Old Uyghur fragments of larger size and gave them call numbers 3 Kr/1–3 Kr/50, 4a Kr/1–4a Kr/76, 4b Kr/1–4b Kr/23. The last part of the collection was sorted by the researchers of the AM after 1918 and obtained call numbers 4b Kr/24–4b Kr/236, Kr IV/224–Kr IV/879¹⁰³. Photographs of manuscript fragments with call numbers

3 Kr/26–3 Kr/50¹⁰⁴ were transferred to the AM by Sergei E. Malov in 1928, after the publication of USp.

Krotkov subcollection comprises 4454 Old Uyghur manuscript and blockprint fragments. More than 800 fragments of Uyghur texts are written on the reverse of Chinese scrolls, while 28 — on the reverse of Sogdian manuscripts. *SI 6603–SI 6613* include 530 Old Uyghur fragments of a rather small size sealed in 11 Melinex lists. Being the largest subcollection of the Old Uyghur book fragments, it includes Mahāyāna and non-Mahāyāna texts, Chinese apocrypha and secular documents.

Another document in Old Uyghur is found on the verso side of the item *G 120* kept at the Mongolian collection of the IOM¹⁰⁵.

Oldenburg subcollection (O)

Sergei Fyodorovich Oldenburg (1863–1934), a prominent Russian Orientalist, director of the AM – IOS from 1916 to 1934, obtained numerous manuscript fragments written in different Central Asian scripts during the First and Second Russian Turkestan Expeditions (1909–1910 and 1914–1915). Sergei F. Oldenburg's First Russian Turkestan Expedition chiefly focused on the northern oases of Eastern Turkestan, i.e. Karashar, Turfan and Kucha, where about a dozen surface and cave Buddhist temples were investigated¹⁰⁶.

As a result, several hundred manuscript fragments were brought to St. Petersburg. Although the fragments (mainly found in the sites of Bäzäklik, Idikut Shari, Toyuk Mazar and Chiktim located in Turfan area) were considered to be of special value, Sergei F. Oldenburg was deeply frustrated with the small amount and preservation state of his finds. A prominent Russian Indologist, Fyodor I. Shcherbatsky (1866–1942) summarized the results of the expedition the following way: “*As a result, when the expedition led by S.F. [Oldenburg] set out, that country had already been visited by a large number of other expeditions that had literally plundered the area, archaeologically speaking. Having arrived in their wake, the Russian expedition could but establish this fact and return home practically empty-handed*”¹⁰⁷.

Nowadays the Oldenburg subcollection includes 102 items in Old Uyghur: *SI 3114/1* (O/66), *SI 3116/3* (O/7c), *SI 3161* (O/49a-d), *SI 3162* (O/50), *SI 4586* (O/2-6), *SI 4603* (O/3-9,1–O/3-9,2)–*SI 4605* (O/3-9,4), *SI 4609* (O/4-4), *SI 4620* (O/5-10,1), *SI 4621* (O/5-10,2), *SI 4624* (O/6-

2), *SI 4664* (O/15-1)–*SI 4667* (O/15-4), *SI 4671* (O/15-8), *SI 4679* (O/16-4B)–*SI 4685* (O/16-9), *SI 4686* (O/29)–*SI 4688* (O/31), *SI 4691* (O/36)–*SI 4693* (O/38), *SI 4695* (O/41)–*4713* (O/48a-d), *SI 4614* (O/51), *SI 4716* (/54)–*SI 4717* (O/55), *SI 4718* (O/73), *SI 4720* (O/76), *SI 4724* (O/26), *SI 4725* (O/56)–*SI 4732* (O/63), *SI 4735* (O/70), *SI 4738* (O/77a)–*SI 4765* (O/105), *SI 4768* (O/109), *SI 4776* (O/113a-b)–*SI 4777* (O/113c), *SI 4820* (O/39)–*SI 4823* (O/40c), *SI 4824* (O/48d), *SI 4836* (O/198), *SI 6560*). Moreover, fragments, preserved separately and registered as “Toyuk Mazar, 1909” most likely refer to this subcollection, are under research nowadays. By now 60 fragments in Old Uyghur, 35 of which are written on the reverse side of Chinese scrolls, have obtained call numbers *SI 6677*, *SI 6678*, *SI 6619*–*SI 6676*. The majority of fragments in the subcollection are too small that makes text identification rather hard if not impossible. The larger ones contain Buddhist texts, though several unique secular documents (*SI 4716* (O/54), *SI 4717* (O/55), *SI 4718* (O/73), *SI 4735* (O/70), *SI 4820* (O/39), *SI 4747* (O/89)) can be found.

Moreover, four fragments, obtained by Sergei F. Oldenburg, were published by Wilhelm Radloff under call numbers O/1¹⁰⁸ and O/2¹⁰⁹.

Petrovsky subcollection (P)

Nikolai Fyodorovich Petrovsky (1837–1908) was one of the Russian diplomats who contributed greatly to academic research of the Eastern Turkestan region. Appointed as a Russian Consul in Kashgar in 1882, he collected manuscripts and art objects, buying them from the local people of Kucha, Korla, and Aksu and carrying out archaeological excavations, primarily in Kucha. Between the years 1892 and 1893, Nikolai F. Petrovsky forwarded to Sergei F. Oldenburg over 100 folios and fragments of manuscripts that he purchased from inhabitants of Turfan. In 1905 he donated the entire Eastern Turkestan collection of the manuscripts to the RCMA, that was later transferred to the AM. According to the archival documents, a part of the manuscripts was purchased after his death from his widow, Sofiya A. Petrovskaya, for 1300 rubles¹¹⁰.

The Petrovsky subcollection includes 582 items, four of which are in Old Uyghur. These are two fragments in cursive script *SI 1924* (P/132), *SI 3629* (P/1253) and two documents written on wooden tablets *SI 3660* (P/137д), *SI 3671* (P/1406).

Malov subcollection (M, MA)

In 1909–1911 and 1913–14, Sergei Efimovich Malov (1880–1957) made journeys to Eastern Turkestan (Chuguchak, Urumchi, Turfan, Kharakhoja, Hami, Suzhou) and Central China

(Lopnor, Aksu, Yarkend, Khotan and Kashgar). His expeditions pursued ethnographic and linguistic research, rather than having archaeological goals. The main aim of Malov's journeys was to study the language and everyday life of the local Turkic nationalities, i.e. the Uyghur, the Yellow Uyghur, the Lopnor and the Salar peoples. Sergei E. Malov also acquired abundant ethnographic material from Turkic nationalities native to Eastern Turkestan (transferred to the Peter the Great Museum of Anthropology and Ethnography (the Kunstkamera) in 1925). Moreover, he took a large number of photographs, many of which are now kept at the IOM, RAS. Besides, Sergei E. Malov acquired a number of manuscript fragments in Old Uyghur and other languages, i.e. Khotan Saka, Sanskrit, Mongolian¹¹¹, Tibetan¹¹² and Chinese.

The major part of his collection was customarily transferred by the RCMA to the AM. Some fragments, passed by the RCMA together with the Malov's ethnographic collection to the Museum of Anthropology and Ethnography, were transferred to the AM in 1925.

Fragments of a *Sitātapatrādhāraṇī* blockprint SI 4502 (M/5) and two documents from Turfan SI 4503 (M/6), SI 4504 (M/7) purchased by Sergei E. Malov during his second expedition to China were personally passed by him to the IOS in 1952. Several fragments were transmitted to the IOS after Malov's death. They were found in his private archive and obtained call numbers MA during inventory procedures in 1994.

Malov subcollection includes 24 items in Old Uyghur language kept under the call numbers SI 4498–SI 4504 (M/1–M/7), SI 4559–SI 4575 (MA/1–MA/11-4). His major finds were the largest extant text of the Old Turkic version of the *Suvarṇaprabhāsottamasūtra* (Altun Yaruk) SI 4498 (M/1), SI 4500 (M/3) and the accompanying text *Buyan ävirmäk* SI 4499 (M/2) discovered during his first expedition in a temple near the village of Wenzhu kou (文珠口)¹¹³ near Suzhou (Gansu province, PRC).

Kozlov subcollection (Koz)

In 1907–1909, a large number of manuscripts and woodblock prints in various languages were discovered by the Russian traveller and explorer Pyotr Kuzmich Kozlov (1863–1935) at the ruins of the “dead city” of Khara-khoto. The unearthed texts include numerous Tangut manuscripts and prints, in addition to those written in Chinese, Mongolian and Tibetan. One Old Uyghur fragment SI 4841 (Koz/5) is found in this subcollection¹¹⁴.

Miscellaneous subcollection (Uig)

The subcollection of miscellaneous manuscript fragments marked as **Uig** includes 27 items SI 3156 (Uig/3), SI 3157 (Uig/12), SI 5066 (Uig/19), SI 6534–SI 6557 (Uig/1–Uig/2, Uig/4–Uig/11, Uig/13–Uig/18). It is obvious that this subcollection was formed to unite manuscript fragments with unknown provenance or separate fragments brought by other researchers.

Thus, call numbers Uig/1 and Uig/2 (now *SI* 6534 and *SI* 6535 correspondingly) were assigned to Chagatai official documents of the 15th century written in Old Uyghur script that were handed over to Vasily V. Barthold in 1902 in Margilan (Fergana Region in eastern Uzbekistan). Manichaean fragments of small size and fragments of miniatures and drawings made on cloth and paper such as *SI* 5066 (Uig/19), *SI* 6547–*SI* 6553 (Uig/17), *SI* 6554–*SI* 6557 (Uig/18) were also included in this subcollection.

The provenance of the remaining items now can be determined with sufficient certainty. As it was mentioned above, *SI* 6544 (Uig/14), *SI* 6545 (Uig/15), *SI* 6545 (Uig/16) with confidence, and *SI* 6539 (Uig/7), *SI* 6540 (Uig/8, Uig/9), *SI* 6542 (Uig/11) with some uncertainty, belong to Roborovsky and Klementz subcollection respectively.

Until recently the details of the acquisition of the unique manuscript of the *Xuanzang biography* *SI* 3156 (Uig/3), *SI* 6538 (Uig/6) and *Abitaki sūtra* *SI* 6536–*SI* 6537 (Uig/4-Uig/5) were unknown. However, analysing the archival documents it became obvious that these Old Uyghur manuscript fragments were sent to the IOS in 1932 by the supervisor of the Second Oriental department of the People's Commissariat for Foreign Affairs, Boris I. Kozlovsky (1899–1975)¹¹⁵.

Processing the Old Uyghur fragments

The collections of Old Uyghur manuscript and blockprint fragments were built up according to the chronological sequence of the new arrivals. From the very beginning the AM (later — IOS) aims included not only preservation and inventorying, but also cataloguing¹¹⁶ and academic research that would make the materials widely available to the academic community. According to the archival documents (Archives of Orientalists, Coll. 152, Inv. 1a, item 61: the Department of History and Philology of the Imperial Academy of Sciences meeting record dated January 11, 1917) in 1917, Sergei F. Oldenburg had the intention to request Sergei E. Malov to sort and make a catalogue of the acquired fragments: “*The Director of the Asiatic Museum [Sergei F. Oldenburg] requested a permission to entrust S.E. Malov the process of inventorying of the Old Uyghur manuscripts [kept in] the Asiatic Museum, under the same conditions as Boris Ya. Vladimirtsov, who was engaged in inventorying of the Mongolian books. At the same time, the Director of the Asiatic Museum informed that W.W. Radloff kindly signified consent to supervise the inventory process. Permitted, shall be reported to the Director of the Asiatic Museum*”. However, due to the Russian revolution of 1917 and the events that followed, these intentions were never translated into reality.

Nevertheless, the research on the Old Uyghur manuscript and blockprint fragments was started soon after their transference to the AM. A large part of the texts were published already at the beginning of the 20th century due to the combined efforts of the brilliant Turcologists

Wilhelm Radloff and Sergei E. Malov. They edited and published the more ‘voluminous’ fragments — *Xuāstvānīft*, the Manichaean confession of sins¹¹⁷, an Uyghur version of the *Diśastvustik* (Skt. Diśāsauvāstikasūtra)¹¹⁸, the *Avalokiteśvarasūtra* or chapter 25 of the Chinese translation of the *Saddharma-puṇḍarīkasūtra* (Kuanši-im Pusar)¹¹⁹, *Suvarṇaprabhāsottamasūtra* known as *Altun Yaruk*¹²⁰, and numerous fragments of Buddhist texts and secular documents¹²¹.

After Wilhelm Radloff’s death there was no specialist in Old Uyghur language at the AM. Sergei E. Malov was never affiliated with the AM or IOS, although he provided assistance in inventorying and identification of fragments. This is proved by the numerous handwritten notes, found among the manuscripts of the Serindia collection and mentioned in Lyudmila V. Dmitrieva’s article concerning Old Uyghur texts kept at the IOS¹²². By Sergei E. Malov’s efforts the photocopies used in the USp edition were transferred from the Publishing house to the AM.

The research was resumed only in the 1960s. Thus, Lyudmila V. Dmitrieva (1924–1997) re-edited and published the *Xuāstvānīft*. In turn, Liliya Yu. Tugusheva (1932–2020) published fragments of the 5th, 6th, 8th and 10th juans of the *Biography of Xuanzang*¹²³ and some Buddhist texts and secular documents, including contracts, private and official letters etc. Later, she edited the Uyghur version of the *Daśakarmapathāvadānamālā*¹²⁴ (in cooperation with Masahiro Shōgaito), the *Abitaki sūtra* (‘Sūtra of the White Lotus Society’)¹²⁵, and published re-editions of the *Xuāstvānīft* and secular documents of the 10th–14th cc.¹²⁶.

The contribution to the study of the Old Uyghur fragments kept in the IOM made by foreign researchers could not be overestimated. Due to the efforts of the European researchers Peter Zieme, György Kara, Simone-Christiane Raschmann, Abdurishid Yakup and the Japanese colleagues, Masahiro Shōgaito, Juten Oda, Dai Matsui, Takao Moriyasu, Hiroshi Umemura, Kōichi Kitsudō, various fragments of Buddhist texts and civil documents were identified and published.

Although a preliminary list of the Old Uyghur fragments was published in 2002 under the title “A Provisional Catalogue of the Microfilms of Uigur, Sogdian and Manichaean Manuscripts

belonging to the St. Petersburg Branch of the Institute of Oriental Studies, Russian Academy of Sciences brought to the Tōyō Bunko” by Hiroshi Umemura, Masahiro Shōgaito, Yutaka Yoshida and Abdurishid Yakup, this work did not find the necessary acceptance due to its limited distribution¹²⁷.

The present publication can be considered to be a result of cooperation of the researchers of the IOM, RAS and Tōyō Bunko in the framework of the agreement signed in spring, 1996 between the St. Petersburg Branch of the Institute of Oriental Studies of Russian Academy of Science, and Tōyo Bunko¹²⁸. Thus, nowadays 564 of the preserved 4730 items in Old Uyghur are published. Here, we express our hope that the catalogue carried out by the researchers of the IOM, RAS in cooperation with the Tōyō Bunko will give a new impetus to further projects of editing the Old Uyghur texts of the IOM.

This catalogue is presented to the academic community with the hope that it will make the Serindia collection of the IOM, RAS more accessible. It has been a century since the Old Uyghur book fragments were brought to St. Petersburg, yet their major part still has to be examined. We regard this work as important since cataloguing and editing the unknown material of the IOM will provide researchers with the new results in exploring the Old Uyghur culture in Central Asia: from the times of the West Uyghur Kingdom to the Yuan period when it was influenced by the Mongol Empire.

The identification of major part Chinese texts was carried out by Mr. Akihito Yoshida.

Header

The catalogue number appears in the header on the left, parallel to the actual ‘SI...’ call number and the former call number (in use before the last thorough inventorying of the Serindia collection that started in 2006).

SI¹²⁹ call numbers, used after throughout inventorying started in 2006, consist of up to 4 digits. In cases several fragments of different manuscripts with the same former call number are

preserved under one SI call number a slash sign ‘/’ is used (e.g. SI 3716/1 (Kr VII/1), SI 3716/4 (Kr VII/1)).

For the fragments edited by Wilhelm Radloff that are not found nowadays in the Serindia collection, hyphen mark ‘—’ is used (cat. entries # 0491, 0567, 0027, 0301, 0268, 0436). For the fragments preserved only in photocopies, the IOM Photo collection call number (e.g. ΦB-277) is indicated.

The only preserved fragment without SI call number included is *G 120* (entry # 0566), kept nowadays in the Mongolian collection of the IOM, RAS. It was decided to include the description in the catalogue as according to the archival data, it was transferred to the AM by Nikolai N. Krotkov.

For a large part of fragments with different texts on recto and verso sides, SI code is accompanied by indication ‘/recto’ or ‘/verso’ (e.g. SI 3858/verso). When a manuscript bears writing on both sides, the side which was written first is considered as recto. In some cases, recto/verso cannot be clearly determined by this criterion. Consequently, the designations of recto and verso in the catalogue do not always reflect the temporal order of writing. In the case of bilingual manuscripts with Old Uyghur on one side and a Chinese or Sogdian text on the other, the Old Uyghur side has been designed as verso.

Former call numbers are given in the way they are indicated in the IOM modern register lists and inventory books. The hyphen mark ‘—’, used in the place of former call number, is applied to the fragments that in most instances were acquired during conservation procedures (e.g. fragment separation).

Collection

Name of the person, who obtained the particular manuscript or blockprinted fragment, and preserved provenance information are indicated. In case provenance impossible to determine or doubtful (e.g. for fragments preserved in photographs only), question mark (?) is used.

Type

Indication of the book type: manuscript or blockprint. Recto and verso sides are mentioned correspondingly. For entries dedicated to verso side, verso side is outlined first.

Script

All scripts detected are outlined for both recto and verso sides.

Script type

Although Takao Moriyasu conducted an extensive research on the diachronic palaeography of the Old Uyghur script, the script type is designated as ‘Calligraphic’ or ‘Cursive’. Script type is relevant only for Old Uyghur writing.

The exception is made for fragments written in North Turkestan Brāhmī script (# 0570, 0574, 0575, 0576, 0579-0585). For these cases ‘Semi-calligraphic’ type is used.

Format

The form is one of the following: scroll (both vertically and horizontally oriented), a-pustaka (portrait format), b-pustaka (wide format), concertina, booklet, codex or single sheet. The latter is used only for civil documents. In case the format is impossible to determine due to the small size of the fragment, question mark ‘(?)’ is used.

Description

The short description contains comments on the physical condition of the text. For the majority of entries we used designation ‘Fragment’ as the only preserved complete texts in the Serindia collection are documents, written on a single sheet of paper. If the condition of the preserved fragment allows to provide more detailed information (e.g. number of complete or partly preserved folios, particular parts of the folios), definition ‘Fragment’ is omitted. The majority of ‘defects’ commonly observed on the fragments (tears, creases, holes, traces of insects, watermarks) are not indicated. Most of them will be eliminated during the forthcoming conservation and preservation procedures¹³⁰. Exception is made for the special types of damages (surface abrasion, ink crumbling etc.)

‘Almost complete’ is used for documents with insignificant damages (e.g. corner distortion).

In the case of Chinese-Uyghur bilingual manuscripts, the Old Uyghur texts are written on the reverse of the Chinese scrolls. As it is rather common for Old Uyghur fragments, this information is not repeated. The number of preserved paper panels (pasted together to produce scroll) is indicated.

The present location of a significant number of fragments (31) described here is unknown. In these cases, the description is given on the basis of the photographs preserved at the IOM, RAS. Photographs of their verso sides are not preserved in the collection of the Institute.

Size

The maximum height and width of a fragment (based on the vertical reading direction) are given in cm. The asterix mark ‘*’ is used for fragments that require conservation treatments. Changes of size of the fragments undergone conservation procedures (moisturizing and flattening) is observed frequently (from several mm for fragments of smaller size, up to several cm for long scrolls).

For fragments preserved in the Photo collection of the IOM, this information is omitted since there is no tape measure on the photographs.

Paper

While examining the Old Uyghur fragments two types of paper were identified. For paper with chain and laid lines the traditional term ‘laid’ was used. The number of laid lines per 1 cm is indicated in round brackets (e.g. 3–4/cm). ‘Woven’ is applied for description of nonhomogeneous paper without laid lines, that frequently contains small pieces of solid, dark brown, pulp impurities¹³¹.

Often the sheets of paper used in Central Asia do not have a uniform thickness. This is the result of the conditions and the methods of papermaking used, which do not always allow for adequate separation of fibres and for precise pouring of sheets of the same thickness. Therefore, it was decided not to use micrometre, but apply general thickness characteristics: thick, medium thick and thin.

The colour of the paper usually ranges from yellowish to dark brown. According to recent paper studies (Agnieszka Helman-Ważny, Ching Chao-jung), no organic substance that could be responsible for the colour was detected. Thus, it is obvious that the paper colour of the preserved fragments is tightly connected with the ambient conditions of the areas where they were found. Frequently colour gradations are observed within a single fragment. Moreover, the paper colour changes considerably after conservation treatments (due to the application of moisture or solvents). Considering this it was decided to give a general description of the paper colour (yellowish, brown-yellowish) not based on the existing colour charts.

Elements

In addition to the external characteristics of the fragments, such as guidelines, frames and ‘rails’ denoting the borders of the text, decorative circles around the hole for binding, ink colour (if not black), differences in line length and spacing, pagination and Brāhmī glosses are listed.

Data on text width and margins was not included for several reasons. First of all, these measures may vary significantly within the same manuscript (e.g. deviation (up to 1.5 cm) of bottom margin size is detected even within one folio of Daśakarmapathāvadānamālā). On the other hand, as it was mentioned before, they may change after conservation procedures (after flattening creases and bends).

The cases when the lines of the Uyghur text on the reverse of a Chinese scroll are written at an angle of 90° (“in perpendicular direction”) to the earlier Chinese text, are mentioned.

For civil documents, seals, stamps (tamga) and personal signs (nišan) are marked.

Number of lines

The number of lines is given considering all recognizable lines, even if only remnants of graphemes are still preserved. Deviations from this method are noted separately. Line length is the measurement of the longest complete line of the extant text. Line spacing measurement is carried out from one “longitudinal axis” to the next.

Contents

Whenever possible the title of work is provided in Sanskrit or Chinese. For the texts that had been edited but not identified general information found in the edition is used.

Publication / Quotation / Facsimile

The aim is to provide a comprehensive overview of the publications and facsimile reproductions of the texts described here. Completeness of quotations most probably could not be reached in the process of this cataloguing.

Notes

Additional information could be found in the section. A plus mark ‘+’ is used to indicate fragments that could be directly jointed together. Mark ‘+...+’ outlines fragments of the same manuscript or blockprint. ‘Cf.’ marks parallel text fragments in Serindia collection of the IOM, RAS and other world manuscript collections, mainly Turfan collection in Berlin.

Here notes (most of them were made by Wilhelm Radloff) in the margins and paper the fragments are pasted to are also mentioned.

Appendix

Photo Collection of Old Uyghur texts of the IOM, RAS

Preserved separately, the Photo collection of the IOM, RAS includes several thousand photocopies of Oriental books and manuscript fragments in various languages and scripts, along with photos taken during multiple expeditions of the Russian travellers to Asian countries¹³⁹. As the catalogue of the collection is still absent (register book is prepared by the researchers of the Institute), the total number and contents of the preserved materials remain obscure. The Old Uyghur part of the collection is represented by various materials kept under call numbers ΦA, ΦB, etc.

It is known that part of the Old Uyghur photocopies were transferred to the AM in the 20s of the 20th c. In the register list ‘Arch. 69’ from 1918 (Lists of Uyghur collections of the Asiatic Museum) compiled by Sergei F. Oldenburg¹⁴⁰ the following items are listed:

1. Booklet with signature “Uyghur manuscript photographs”, 28 photos;

According to preserved notes by Sergei E. Malov, part of Old Uyghur manuscript photocopies, in particular that were included in USp, were transferred to him by Wilhelm Radloff to prepare USp for publication, and the Publishing house of the Academy of Sciences engaged in printing USp.

A large number of the Old Uyghur materials included into the Photo collection is represented by photographs of the manuscript fragments preserved in Germany and Japan. According to various archival documents, the photographs were sent to Wilhelm Radloff by foreign colleagues. The photographs of Säkiz yükmäk yaruk obtained by the Otani expedition (ΦA-84, ΦB-277/13) and nowadays preserved in Ryūkoku collection, were most probably granted to Wilhelm Radloff

by a renowned Japanese scholar Professor Tōru Haneda¹⁴¹. It is also known that German researcher, Albert Grünwedel also supplied Wilhelm Radloff with a large group of photographs of the Uyghur documents that were later edited in USp.










