Cultural Places, Museums and Theatre

The Gandan Tegchenling Monastery

The Gandan Tegchenling Monastery is the Center for Mongolian Buddhists. It is the largest and most significant monastery in Mongolia and one of Ulaanbaatar's most interesting sights. Constructed by order of the 5th Jebtsundampa in 1809, it is the only monastery where Buddhist services continued to function even during the communist past. Temples are flocked by visitors during religious services that start at 10 am and last until mid day.

Cost: Free

The Bogd Khaan Palace Museum

The palace complex consists of seven temples, grouped symmetrically around two courtyards, with exterior painted finishes in bright red, green, blue, white, and gold colors. Designed according to Russian and European traditions, the palace was completed in 1905, and a new ceremonial gate was added during the Bogd Khan's rule to celebrate Mongolian independence.

Cost: 2 USD

The National Museum of Mongolia

The National Museum of Mongolia is a cultural, scientific, and educational organization that presents Mongolian history and culture from the dawn of humanity to the present day. A significant responsibility for preserving Mongolian cultural heritage therefore lies with the museum.

Cost: Free

Transport: 5 minutes walk to the south from the Uni Bld No 1

The National Library of Mongolia

The National Library of Mongolia is the largest and the oldest surviving library in Mongolia. It houses over 3 million books and publications, 1 million of which are rare and valuable books, sutras and manuscripts, including the world's only surviving copies of many ancient Buddhist texts.

Cost: Free



The Choijin Lama Temple Museum

The Choijin Lama Temple Museum is an architectural masterpiece of the 19th and 20th century. The monastery was erected by Mongolian architects. The temple was built between 1904 and 1908 by the 8th Bogd Khaan Janzandamba, and dedicated to his brother lama Luvsankhaidav.

Cost: Adult 5000 MNT, Photo 25000 MNT, Video 50000 MNT

The Fine Arts Museum

The Fine Arts G. Zanabazar Museum was founded in 1966. The museum is renowned for the works of G. Zanabazar (1635-1724), which include the statues of Sita Tara, the Five Dhayani Buddhas and the Bodhi Stupa. It has 12 exhibition galleries covering the arts from ancient civilizations up to the beginning of the 20th Century.

Cost: Adult 5000 MNT, Photo 20000 MNT, Video 25000 MNT Transport: 5 minutes walk to the south from the Uni Bld No 1

The Mongolian National Song and Dance Academic Ensemble

The Mongolian National Song and Dance Ensemble puts on performances for tourists throughout the summer in the National Academic Drama Theatre.
